Our Mission

The Compass Partnership of Schools is an ethical and ambitious learning community that seeks to inspire every child to value their education, know themselves, understand others and work to create a fair, just and sustainable society.

Our Curriculum Offer

Over the past eight weeks Compass schools have provided a full curriculum offer online for all children to support their learning at home. We have taken the decision to make this offer consistent across all our schools so that teachers can plan together and ensure children have the same curriculum experience.

Our teachers have worked together to develop an essentials curriculum that provides an initial 7-week map of learning in maths, reading, writing, and spelling as well as structured content from across the foundation subjects. This offer will be the same across all six mainstream schools and will determine the curriculum on offer to those children who are able to be in school and those who still need to be at home. The curriculum will allow year group teams to collaborate across our Trust of schools and to ensure teachers can balance the needs of remote learning as well as learning that

takes place in the classroom. It will ensure that children get an agreed curriculum offer regardless of where they are learning and will enable teachers to share the planning and delivery of lessons and curriculum content.

We have organised planning teams for all our teachers from across the Trust so that they are supported in ensuring the curriculum on offer is as good as it can be. This does mean that children in each school may see teachers from other Compass schools delivering some of the sessions but these will have been planned together with their own teacher and it will be their own teacher that oversees the curriculum for their class.

Why are we doing this?

- To ensure children in school and at home have the same quality offer as this period extends
- To increase the trust's capacity to plan and deliver high quality online learning
- To support teachers in managing both online and home learning
- To support teachers' capacity to maintain contact with classes through Google Meets, Showbie and Tapestry in some early years classes
- To give teachers the emotional and physical support of their colleagues whilst delivering school and home learning
- To support those teachers who just cannot do as much as others because of home context – we are sharing the load.

We welcome teachers sharing their recorded/videoed lessons as this supports all our children.

Each year group team will decide how the team will plan and share resources including those they might want to select from online resources and platforms such as Oak National Academy. So your child will have a broad range of learning opportunities as part of our offer.

The offer for each week will be consistent and will ensure your children learns from across the curriculum.

This is what the curriculum will look like for your child regardless of whether they are at home or at school. The live meet sessions will depend on capacity as we open schools to more children but your school will keep you up to date with changes.
